- Artist needed to illustrate and design a manual that takes artisans through the workshop process in a fun and engaging format.
- The selected artist will be working closely with Sharon Heading, Arts Recovery Project Coordinator, to adapt the existing program content into manual.

Eligibilities

Artist must be a Wood Buffalo resident for the duration of the project.

Work Media

Finished manual will be digital format, both print ready and shareable through online platforms.

Artist Fee

The successful artist will receive an all-inclusive fee of \$4,000, covering all illustration, layout, and design of the *Getting to Sold* manual.
